KJ's Story

K.J. Pugh (back row, far left on the front cover) never pictured himself being a cycling enthusiast before moving to the UK. The Pughs relocated to North Yorkshire from the States in 2014, in order for K.J. to be one of the pastors of Grace Church Boroughbridge.

Within their first year in Boroughbridge, Jono Webb (back row, far right) challenged K.J. to do the forty-five mile 'Palace to Palace' ride in London to benefit the Prince's Trust. "For someone who hadn't been on a bike since the tender age of fourteen," K.J. said, "forty-five miles seemed like an impossible distance!" But once committed to the endeavour, it came as a pleasant surprise how enjoyably and quickly the miles flew by. After the London charity ride, a growing group of local men formed who were looking for other big challenges to attempt. A Coast-to-Coast cycle ride along 'The Way of the Roses' eventually dominated their conversations.

"It took a surprising number of planning meetings at the Black Bull to pull the whole venture together," some of the men's wives were overheard saying. When all the planning for the 170-mile trek was finally done, the men set themselves to raise some money for various charities. Dementia and cancer research were selected by some of the men, but K.J. wanted to find a charity to support that felt very local. "When we first arrived in Boroughbridge," K.J. remarked, "I would plan my monthly calendar with the Lower Ure News in hand. It served as a vital gateway into the life of my newly adopted community." So, when K.J. heard that the Lower Ure News was in danger of going out of print *(becoming a web-only publication)* without its volunteer staff receiving some needed funding, he knew exactly what his local charity should be.

In the week before the ride, K.J. set up a JustGiving.com page for the Lower Ure News with the ambitious goal of raising £600. It's a testament to the new power of social media that most of the £600 was raised on the ride itself. As K.J. would post images of the bike ride to Facebook, Twitter and Instagram, people would give to sponsor different stretches of the route. "It was a great way of feeling like people were part of the journey with you and getting behind a cause that you felt passionate about," K.J. said. A special word of thanks needs to be given to BCT Accountants, a local business whose large, last minute donation enabled K.J. to reach the ambitious £600 goal. A big 'Thank You' goes out to everyone who gave so that the Lower Ure News can carry on into the future on a much firmer footing.



KJ presented the cheque to the Editor, Jane Barber, against a background of the Devil's Arrows, which are at the mid-point of The Way of The Roses.

As KJ says, his efforts have ensured LUN can be printed and gives the team time to raise monies from advertising and sponsorship.



From July 16 until the first week in September, the library is participating in the annual, national Summer Reading Challenge for children aged 4-11.


The theme this year is "Animal Agents".

Feeding the Birds in your garden



Most people get a lot of pleasure from feeding the birds in their gardens.

Different people find different aspects of watching garden birds attractive. For some it is just movement and life in the garden – it's the number of birds attracted rather than the species that matter. For others, it's looking for something different to tick off on their personal list. Certainly, there are many

occasions on which a particular bird is only in the garden for a matter of seconds: if you're not looking at that moment you don't see it. It makes you wonder what else you might be missing

Either way, it would seem that being out in the garden with birds all around you, or just sitting watching them visiting feeders and doing the things that birds do, reduces stress levels and improves mental health and general well-being.

But which birds are our favourites? There seems to be a spectrum, from Magpies and Sparrowhawks which many people hate, to Blackbirds and Robins, the latter crowned as our unofficial favourite, which almost everybody loves, possibly because they interact most closely with us, via Sparrows and Starlings which elicit mixed feelings, being boisterous, noisy and often greedy.

Apparently too, those birds we can name give us more pleasure and have a stronger beneficial effect on our well-being. (Do I hear a chorus of "how on earth do they work that one out" at this point?) Anecdotally it is also claimed that the knowledge needed to identify even many of our better-known species is declining. This has a bearing on activities such as the annual Great Garden Bird Watch where anything small and brown is a sparrow – the wee brown jobbies as Billy Connelly probably never called them. Maybe bird recognition should go on the national curriculum!

Another aspect of all this feeding is the effect it has on the birds themselves. Our neighbours in Europe have quite a different take on feeding birds, a matter I'll come back to in a future article. But there is clear evidence in a BTO study of Blackcap migration using Garden BirdWatch data, which shows that a combination of climate change and garden feeding has caused the majority of German Blackcaps to overwinter in southern England instead of around the Mediterranean as they used to. I'm far from sure that human activities which change the habits of supposedly wild birds can be called positive.
