## Running the Roman Home Alex Croom, Tyne and Wear Museums

#### Saturday 20th May 2.30pm

#### Aldborough Village Hall



Alex looks after the archaeology collections of four museums within Tyne and Wear Archives and Museums. "As we look after two Roman Forts, much of the material is Roman in date, but the rest covers everything from Ancient Egypt to industrial archaeology of the late nineteenth century! Needless to say, I am particularly interested in the Romans and love trying to find out more about their everyday lives."

Author of "Running the Roman Home" which explores the real everyday life of the Romans and the effort required to run a Roman household, Alex is currently acknowledged as one of the experts on this subject in the country. Her talk will use evidence from literary, archaeological and artistic sources to make comparisons with historical and modern parallels and to help bring a Roman household to life.

Alex is back by popular demand following her talk on "Roman Costume in Northern England" in July 2016.

#### **Milby Island Improvement Project**



The walk alongside the river Ure to Milby Lock from the bridge in Boroughbridge is an important asset for local people and for visitors alike. The amount of maintenance on this island between the river and canal has reduced in recent years resulting in a poorer environment and one which can only worsen as invasive plants such as Himalayan balsam and giant hogweed take hold.

The area is now choked in the summer months by the Himalayan balsam which reaches eight feet in height, suppressing all other wild flowers and obstructing views of the river. The Milby Island Project has been set up by Charlie Merson, a Milby resident, and so far, has the support of Kirby Hill (Milby) and Langthorpe Parish Councils, The Canals and River Trust and Newby Hall Estate, the owner of the land.

At the end of March, as our picture shows, volunteers started work on clearance of large amounts of flood debris and dead timber so that later in the year the area can be 'topped' to eradicate the balsam and hogweed in selected areas - to open up views and let other plants have a chance. Lister Farms kindly loaned the heavy equipment and volunteers from Milby



helped Charlie make a start on the project, which hopefully will be ongoing throughout the year if its aims are to be achieved.

#### The Cuckoo



Why we have lost almost two thirds of our population of these iconic birds in the last 20 years?

UK Cuckoos spend the winter around the Congo rainforest. Where they winter and the routes they use to get there could be an important factor in determining the causes of their decline.

Cuckoos spend about two months in Britain, about six months in Africa, and the other four months of the year migrating.

They head out of the UK in a variety of directions, some due east across the North Sea to the Netherlands and Belgium while others head south across the English Channel into France.

One migration route was found through Italy. In the first year two Cuckoos went via Spain, highlighting a brand new migration route with a stopover site north of Madrid. This has been followed by many English birds. It has a higher mortality rate than the Italian route.

Stop-over sites are important fuelling areas for migrant birds, allowing them to fatten up for the journey ahead. Many of our Cuckoos have spent time near the River Po in Italy; others stopped in Spain which latterly has been afflicted by droughts which have probably reduced the quantity of food available to fatten up.

Cuckoos followed so far, use a different return route back to the UK to the one they use on their outward migration. They head to West Africa before making the return crossing over the Sahara Desert. This could be linked to a weather system called the Inter Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ). The rains produce sufficient food for the return journey.

Increasing the number of individuals tagged, and following them for a number of years allows us to answer yet more questions. Short-term studies can give misleading results; for example, the habitats that were used in the Congo basin by English and Scottish Cuckoos in the first two years are not the same habitats being used in latterly.
