North Yorkshire Trading Standards have formed a new multi-agency safeguarding team whose primary role is to protect vulnerable adults from financial abuse.

Financial abuse can take many forms but this team is tasked primarily with investigating:

- Doorstep crime
- Distraction burglary
- Scam mail, including prize draw & lottery scams and clairvoyant scams.
- Telephone scams, including investment frauds.
- Investment frauds
- Romance frauds
- Land banking frauds
- Internet frauds targeted at older adults & the vulnerable
- Fraud against vulnerable adults by family and carers

There are simple steps residents can take to protect themselves:

- 1. Do not engage with cold callers. Politely tell them you are not interested and close the door
- 2. NEVER give your bank details to anyone calling you on the phone. Your bank or the police will never ask you for account or PIN numbers
- 3. Ensure your computer has some form of Internet security installed (for example Norton or McAfee) to reduce the likelihood of you falling for an internet scam
- 4. If you are cold called on the telephone, do not engage with the caller, just put the phone down
- 5. If in doubt, contact the police on 101

Remember North Yorkshire is a very safe place to live and was recently classed as **the safest place to live in England**. By taking a few careful steps and by looking out for the less able in our community, we can make it safer still.

Thoughts on "Safer Neighbourhoods"



From the point of view of living in safety, the Boroughbridge area is one of the safest in the UK: our crime rate is exceptionally low. There's a humorous, local view that it's all down to PC Neil Waite, our popular and well-respected guardian of law and order (who is not far from retirement, by the way!); but that's only true in part....

No one knows why Boroughbridge is a haven of peace and tranquillity compared with many other towns.

One contributory factor is perhaps an effective Safer Neighbourhood Group (SNG).

"What's SNG?" It's a group of people, including representatives of the police, fire service, neighbourhood watch and the local councils, who meet twice a year to mull over issues of law and order. The SNG is currently chaired by County Councillor, Nick Brown, strongly backed by secretary, Jim Bolland, and meets in the Jubilee Room

You may take the view that merely talking about crime is unlikely to deter local, would-be criminals (there *are* some, by the way; but they tend to maintain a low profile). However, support for the police and getting together to discuss "issues" of law and order is a significant factor in a community which, for most of the time, is law-abiding by consent

The key, current priorities of North Yorkshire Police are:

- •Rural crime combatting crime which affects farms; mainly theft of machinery and stock
- •Technology which focuses on use of cameras (yes, drivers hate them, but it works!)
- Vulnerability safeguarding children from abuse; not what one might expect, perhaps, but a comment on a serious social problem which also includes cybercrime, all too obvious from reports in the media

Police numbers are on the *increase*. The police were expecting 40% "cuts" but, since the Paris terrorist attacks, there has been considerable investment in recruiting. There are, for example, nationally many more armed officers, especially in London; but even in North Yorkshire there are now eight officers who are fire-arms specialists

A final point: *anyone* can attend the meetings of the SNG; you don't have to be a police officer or local councillor. If you are concerned about any issue which touches on safety or law and order, please feel free to attend and have your say; you'd be most welcome

The Red Kite

After an absence of many decades The Red Kite is now seen frequently in the skies over many parts of Yorkshire. It's an elegant bird, soaring on long wings with its long forked tail twisting as

it changes direction.

Both Buzzards and Red Kites are raptors which use their broad wings for soaring and as such are not immediately distinguishable if only seen occasionally. Red Kites are larger than Buzzards with longer wings and the characteristic long forked tail that makes them so agile in flight. Apart from the

usual weight difference the sexes are similar. **John Harding's photograph** shows a Red Kite from below – the most common view we get!

Adult red kites are sedentary birds, and each nesting territory can contain up to five nest sites. Both males and females build the nest using twigs with a lining of grass or other vegetation. They typically add sheep's wool, which they collect along with other unusual items such as pieces of plastic and sometimes even items of clothing: they are true kleptomaniacs! These plastic pieces can have dire consequences though, as they can form a waterproof membrane in the nest, causing pooling of water and failure of eggs or death of the young.

Red kites eat mainly carrion, being too weak-footed to kill any prey much bigger than a small rabbit. They also feed on chicks, small mammals and invertebrates such as beetles and earthworms, particularly in spring. They hunt by flying low over open country, using their forked tails to steer. Live prey is usually caught by surprise rather than speed, although they do sometimes make fast, twisting chases.

Red kites are the closest bird we have to a vulture in Britain, and as scavengers, are particularly susceptible to poisoning. Illegal poison baits set for foxes or crows are indiscriminate and kill protected birds and other animals.

Red Kites were shot and poisoned until, by the end of the 19th century, they had disappeared from England and Scotland.

The very successful Yorkshire Red Kite Project was the fifth in the sequence and began at Harewood Estate in 1999 with 68 birds from the Chilterns being relocated.
